INTRODUCTION

As set out in the Foxhills Golf Club Constitution, the Foxhills Golf Committee is responsible for the smooth operation, promotion, playing and organisation of all club members' competitions.(see pages 53-57 for the full Club Constitution).

This Competition Rules Manual is designed to be one of the sources of information for the Committee and its Members, acting as a source of reference for questions relating to members' competitions run for both adults and juniors. This document will be amended and extended, as required.

GENERAL RULES

Club Competitions

All club competitions must be played independently from all other competitions, with the exception of the Winter Eclectic. Players are not permitted to play a round as part of another competition.

All club competitions are open to adult 7-day Members and Juniors, with the exception of the Autumn Classic, Spring Classic, New Millennium Cup, All Winners Day, Wilkinson Sword and Vice Presidents Day – where Juniors are not eligible to enter (see Junior section page12) Competitors must have a registered Handicap Index and cannot be otherwise precluded from entry at the closing date of

the competition. Individual competitions may have additional rules such as competition handicap limits, or number of qualifying rounds played, which are set out within this manual (pages 15-46)

Members may only enter a competition if their handicap is within the range for the competition and they are not permitted to play off of a lower handicap (with the exception of the Phylidon trophy and the Summer Foursomes - See rules of competitions).

Competitions will be notified by email and/or through HowDidiDo (HDiD) and all members are responsible for keeping their email contact details up to date. Notifications will contain all the required details about that competition, e.g. name of the competition, handicap limits, qualification criteria, entry fee and closing date.

Starters at all club competitions may ask players to move up a tee-time in order for the event to run more efficiently. This is especially so for monthly and midweek medals. Players refusing to do so may be disqualified from the competition under Rule 1.2a.(See Rules of Golf)

Members playing in any competition/medal must register and pay any relevant entry fee at the competitions desk at least 20 minutes before their tee-time and be at the tee at least 10 minutes before their tee-time. If this procedure is not observed loss of tee-time may result and/or other penalties as may be required or as permitted by the Rules of Golf.

5 day members may play in the following competitions:

- 5 day pairs competitions
- Midweek medals
- Summer Knockout midweek competitions
- Captain's Drive-in, at the discretion of the Captain,
- Tombstone Challenge, when arranged on a weekday,
- Ladies and Mens friendly matches played on a weekday.
- All Club Competitions run on bank holiday Mondays this includes the Foxhills Cup,

- Occasional charity events arranged at the weekends, with the approval of the Captain and Foxhills Management.

No Show Policy

The following no-show policy has been agreed after reviewing a number of other club's policies. It is at the more lenient end of the scale and Foxhills believe that the vast majority of members will see this as an enhancement to their golfing experience in competitions run by the club.

This does not apply to matches arranged between members (the knockouts for example)

"What do I do if I need to withdraw from a competition?"

The start sheet for a competition will be locked at 4pm the night before the competition date. Up until that point in time, competitors will be able to withdraw by removing themselves remotely via HDiD.

Once the competition has been locked, any late withdrawals should email the committee member in charge of the competition or notify the Foxhills Golf proshop.

Notification of withdrawal less than 1 hour before booked tee-time will be deemed to be a no-show.

Examples of no show reasons that will NOT be accepted are:

- It was raining and I didn't want to play,
- My friends signed me up and I didn't realise I was due to play,
- I didn't want to play with those in my group,

"What happens if I no-show?"

FIRST OCCURANCE: The member will receive an email from the captain reminding the player of their obligations to other players. The member may have a perfectly valid reason for no-show and this will be the opportunity to advise. It is understood that on occasions something unavoidable prevents the withdrawing player from giving adequate notice to either the competitions desk on the day or the committee member in charge.

SECOND OCCURANCE: The member will be refused entry to the next two eligible singles events. The member will be advised specifically which competitions these are. Members may be asked to pay the competition entry fee if their tee time has not been able to be filled and where competitions include catering, members may also be asked to repay this cost.

THIRD AND SUBSEQUENT OCCURRENCE: The matter will be referred to the Director of Golf and Captain for discussion to review any further sanctions as appropriate.

"How long does my no-show count for?"

All occurrences will expire after 6 months from the date of the competition at which the no-show occurred.

Scoring and Competition Results

Under Rule 3.3b (Rules of Golf) it is the player and their designated marker who bear responsibility for recording their scores as below. The scores can be recorded on a physical card or by electronic means at the discretion of the Committee.

DIAGRAM 3.3b: SCORECARD RESPONSIBILITIES IN HANDICAP STROKE PLAY

It is preferable, wherever possible, that the entry of competition scores should be by electronic means. This is enabled by the use of HowDidIDo which provides an easy to use mobile app.

Players should sign in to HowDidIDo via a mobile phone and agree who their marker will be before starting the round. After completing the round, they should confirm their handicap is correct (the app will calculate the correct Playing Handicap), confirm the name of their marker and enter the score for each hole. Confirmation of marker and signature are required to avoid disqualification.

Competition Results

Results posted after the competition has finished, will be provisional to allow for appeal. After 7 days without appeal the result(s) will be deemed final.

Appeals from a stroke play event should be made to the Committee as soon as possible either during or immediately after the event.. In Match play events, appeals will only be accepted if new information becomes available to a player which was not known at the time the incident took place.

Handicap Divisions

Players will be separated into Divisions by Handicap Index. These will be Gold (up to and including 10), Silver (11 to 15) and Bronze (16 to 36). The Committee will review these Divisions from time to time to ensure an equal split in relevant competitions.

Playing Handicap and Handicap Allowances.

Handicap allowances are designed to provide equity for players of all levels of ability in each format of competition play, over both 9 holes and 18 holes. They are applied to the Course Handicap to calculate a player's Playing Handicap for the competition.

In general, **after** handicap allowances have been applied in **stroke play formats**, a player receives their full Playing Handicap. In **match play formats**, the player with the lowest Playing Handicap plays off zero strokes relative to the other player(s). and the other player(s) receive(s) the difference between their own Playing Handicap and that of the player with the lowest Playing Handicap.

Examples of Calculations for Pairs Using Different Tees:

GREENSOMES (60%/40%) WITH MULTIPLE TEES (1 PARTNER ON ADJUSTED TEE)

Tom (17.0 Handicap Index) and Tami (17.3 Handicap Index) are on a team playing in a Greensomes competition. Tom is playing from the Men's Blue tee (Slope: 117, Course Rating: 70.2, Par: 71) and Tami is playing from the Ladies Red tee (Slope: 132, Course Rating: 73.8, Par: 73). The unadjusted tee is the Men's Blue tee.

Below is the computation of their Team Playing Handicap.

The Course Handicap is calculated as $\text{index} \times \text{slope} / 113 = 17.0 \times 117 / 113 = 17.601\dots$. The resulting Course Handicap is 17.601\dots. | <p>Calculating the Course Handicap for Tami Smith. The Course Handicap is being calculated for All 18 holes. The initial index is 17.3. This player is on the Red - Ladies tee, the slope is 132, the rating is 73.8 and the par is 73. The Course Handicap is calculated as $\text{index} \times \text{slope} / 113 = 17.3 \times 132 / 113 = 20.208\dots$. The resulting Course Handicap is 20.208\dots. The Course Handicap is rounded to 20. Tami Smith is playing from a different tee than the base tee and you are using relative adjustments. The difference in rating between the tees is 3.6.</p> | | |
| <p>The team Playing Handicap is calculated by sorting the individual Course Handicaps and multiplying them by the following weights: 0.6, 0.4. Therefore, the team handicap is $\text{round}(0.6 \times 18.0 + 0.4 \times 20.0 + 0.5 \times 0 + 0.5 \times 3.6) = 21$.</p> | | |

In addition to multiplying their rounded Course Handicaps by the appropriate factors of .6 and .4, the difference in Course Rating needs to be applied.

In Greensomes formats, the difference in Course Rating adjustment would require adding 50% of the difference for players who are not on the unadjusted tee. Tami is not playing on the unadjusted tee, so 50% of the difference in Course Rating ($.5 \times 3.6 = 1.8$) needs to be applied before rounding to a Team Playing Handicap.

Tom and Tami's Team Playing Handicap rounds to 21.

FOURSOMES (ALTERNATE SHOT) - STABLEFORD WITH MULTIPLE TEES

Jane (10.0 Handicap Index) and John (10.0 Handicap Index) are playing in a Foursomes

(Alternate Shot) Stableford competition where 50% of the combined Team Handicap is used. John is playing from the Men's Blue tee (117/70.2/71) and Jane is playing from the Ladies Red tee (132/73.8/73).

Below is the computation of their Team Playing Handicap.

| <p>Calculating the Course Handicap for Jane Smith. The Course Handicap is being calculated for All 18 holes. The initial index is 10.0. This player is on the Red - Ladies tee, the slope is 132, the rating is 73.8 and the par is 73. The Course Handicap is calculated as $\text{index} \times \text{slope} / 113 = 10.0 \times 132 / 113 = 11.681\dots$. The resulting Course Handicap is 11.681\dots. The Course Handicap is rounded to 12. The player receives an adjustment for the difference in the number of points required to Play to Handicap equal to $36 - (\text{CR} - \text{P})$: $\text{round}(36 - (73.8 - 73)) = \text{round}(36 - 0.8) = 35$ points. The difference between the player's points and the highest number of points required to Play to Handicap is $37 - 35 = 2$ additional strokes. The Playing Handicap becomes 14.0. After rounding, the Playing Handicap is 14.</p> | | |
| <p>Calculating the Course Handicap for John Smith. The Course Handicap is being calculated for All 18 holes. The initial index is 10.0. This player is on the Blue - Men tee, the slope is 117, the rating is 70.2 and the par is 71. The Course Handicap is calculated as $\text{index} \times \text{slope} / 113 = 10.0 \times 117 / 113 = 10.353\dots$. The resulting Course Handicap is 10.353\dots. The Course Handicap is rounded to 10. The player requires the highest number of points to Play to Handicap, no additional strokes are required. After rounding, the Playing Handicap is 10.</p> | | |
| <p>Jane Smith + John Smith combined Playing Handicap is calculated as 50% of individual Course Handicaps. That is $\text{round}(50\% \times (14 + 10)) = 12$.</p> | | |

Because Jane requires the lowest number of points to Play to Handicap (35) compared to the highest number of points to Play to Handicap (37), 2 additional strokes are added to Jane's Playing Handicap. After combining their rounded Course Handicaps and multiplying by .50, the team Playing Handicap rounds to 12.

Prizes

TROPHY, BOARD AND OTHER COMPETITIONS

Prizes are awarded to the winners of trophy and board competitions and will be credited to their Foxhills club card account once the competition has been closed (i.e. results are final) The prize fund will generally be 70% of the net proceeds of the entry fees after all costs including catering. Trophies will be presented on Presentation Day each autumn. Prize allocation is indicated on the detailed competition schedules but these may change to reflect the number of entrants in the competition.

MIDWEEK AND MONTHLY MEDAL COMPETITIONS

For midweek and Monthly medals, prizes will be awarded for 1st ,and2nd places for each division once the competition is closed (i.e. results are final), as per the table below. In addition, there will be a Birdie 2's prize fund which will be allocated to competitors on the basis of the number of birdie 2's scored across all divisions. All prize money will be added to members Foxhills card account. In the event where there are no Birdie 2's on the day of the medal, the money will be donated to the Captain's Charity.

Use of Buggies (or similar motorised vehicles) in Competitions

Players and caddies should always walk unless permission to use a buggy (or similar motorised vehicle) has been given by the Committee prior to the date of the competition or round. The Committee shall maintain a list of all current exemptions. No permissions by members of the Committee on duty at that time will be given on the day of the competition or round

The following describes eligibility for consideration:

Members with permanent disabilities/conditions may, with the permission of the Committee, use buggies, when playing conditions allow. Members with temporary disabilities/conditions may approach the Committee with the appropriate medical certificate, for permission to use buggies.

If permission is given, it will be for a set period of time and will need to be revalidated after that time has elapsed.

Playing partners of members with permission to use a buggy may not use the buggy for equipment nor may they ride as passengers.

Caddies.

The Foxhills Golf committee allow the use of caddies in all handicap competitions, matches and tournaments, Rule 10.3 (Rules of golf) applies.

Associate Member Eligibility for Competitions.

Associate members will not be eligible to play in Board or Trophy competitions and cannot play before 11.00am at weekends.

Associate members will not be eligible to play in competitions which involve more than one round, due to possible complications with extended competition rounds. This includes Knock-out competitions, Club Championship and Fox Trophy.

An Associate Member, who wins a Foxhills Club competition which is a qualifier for an onward or national tournament, will be ineligible to represent the club in that competition. Only Full or Golf Members (five or seven day) may represent the club in onward or national tournaments.

Where an external company co-sponsor or co-brand (with Foxhills) a monthly medal, associate members will still be able to enter the medal and compete for prizes; however, they will not be eligible to win the sponsors prize. Only Full or Golf Members (five or seven day) may win prizes from dual sponsored events.

An Associate member is not eligible for selection to play in a Foxhills Golf Club representative team.

Juniors

Juniors are defined as those members of Foxhills who are under 18 years of age on 1st January in the current year.

Junior Stableford Competitions

Junior Stableford Competitions will be open to all Juniors irrespective of whether they have a handicap. However, those who do not have a handicap will be entering for handicap assessment and will not be eligible to win the medal. The winner of these medals will be eligible to play on Junior All Winners Day.

- Junior Club Championship
- Junior Spring Classic Cup
- Junior Autumn Classic Cup
- Junior New Millennium Cup
- Junior All Winners
- Summer Pairs Knockout Competition
- Winter Singles Knockout Competition

Adult Monthly Medal and Midweek Medal Competitions

Juniors in Gold and Silver divisions may play in 7-day Member Monthly Medals and Midweek Medals, subject to playing off the adult tees. Juniors cannot play as a two ball and if playing as a three ball, one player must be at least 14 years old.

Where an external company co-sponsor a competition during a monthly medal, Junior members will be able to enter the medal, but will not be eligible to win the sponsors prize.

In the event of a Junior winning the Monthly medal, the Junior winner will be eligible for the Juniors All Winners Day.

Other Adult Competitions

The entry of Juniors into Senior Competitions is at the discretion of the Golf Club Committee.

The following are the present guidelines:

Invitation Days

Junior can invite an adult guest.

Prizes

Juniors will be entitled to win prizes which will be in the form of credit on their Foxhills membership account to spend at the club

Caddies

A Caddy may be used by Juniors entering competitions, the caddy must also be a Junior (see local rule posted on Junior’s Notice Board). Caddies. Rule 10.3 (Rules of Golf)

Spectators

Spectators must remain at least 25 metres from the players throughout any competition. There should be no more than 4 spectators per player.

COMPETITIONS OVERVIEW

Monthly Medals and Stableford Competitions

There are generally two standard handicap qualifying competitions each month (one Strokeplay, one Stableford, one on each course, one on a Saturday, one on a Sunday). Play is always from the Red tees for the Ladies except for the Vardon Trophy, General Managers Salver, Goldberg Trophy and Silver Fox Salver. For the men, all three, i.e. blue, white and yellow, of the competition tees are used. Blue tees are generally only used during high season. Yellow tees used mainly when the weather is bad and underfoot is soft and when appropriate for the Bronze division.

Competitions will normally be available for booking three weeks in advance. Members should book a tee time in the competition using the HDiD systems.

Players without handicaps can enter in order to post sufficient rounds to gain a handicap. A player playing in a medal for handicap purposes is exempt from paying entry fees but is also ineligible for prizes.

Signing-In for Competitions & Entering Scores

There are certain requirements players MUST complete both prior to and at the end of the competition.

These steps must be completed PRIOR to commencing a medal round. A player may become ineligible for prizes if either of these steps not completed.

The requirements are:

CHECK IN Prior to starting the round, the player MUST report to the pro-shop. Competition rules and conditions (tees used, local rules in operation, temporary tees or greens, qualifying or non-qualifying, etc.) will be advised. Pay any applicable entry fees to the pro-shop.

SIGN IN Sign-in on HowDidIDo.

SCORE ENTRY At the completion of the round, members are required to enter scores on HowDidIDo.

NB: The Committee has made it a "club regulation" that players assist in the administration of medal competitions by entering their own scores using HowDidIDo if it is a requirement of the competition rules. Failure to do so MAY result in other disciplinary sanctions, such as ineligibility to play in the next club competition(s).

Mid-Week Stablefords

There are generally two Midweek Stableford competitions each month, one on each course.

Booking, check in, sign in and score entry is the same as for the Monthly Medal and Stableford competitions.

Other Competitions

All other competitions will be advertised by email, HowDidIDo, noticeboard and/or any other means to assist in reaching as many members as possible at least 3 weeks prior to playing.

The notice for 'envelope entry' competitions (see schedule of competitions) will be posted at least 3 weeks before the start of the competition and the closing date will be stated on the notice. For those where a draw will be made, the start times will be posted within one week of the closing date. The member must legibly write all the required information on an envelope, to include email address, phone number, handicap and place the entry money in the envelope and post it as specified by the Committee. No entry for a pairs competition will be accepted unless the name of the partner is specified. The draw will be made using these envelopes. The entry fee will be refunded should there be a reason why the entrants do not get into the draw.

Scoring for other competitions will be either by mobile app or physical card. Details to be included in the rules for the competition which should be distributed to all participants before the event.

Knock Out Competitions

Members may sign-up for participation in Knock Out Competitions subject to having a registered Handicap Index and are not otherwise precluded as at the closing date of entry..As the knock-outs are multi-round competitions, Associate Members are not eligible to enter.

Caddies are allowed in all Knock-out competitions, however, should any player wish to have a caddie they should inform their partner (where applicable) and opponents prior to the match.

The dates by which the various rounds of the Match Play competition must be played will be displayed on the draw sheets.. If a single member of a pair has to withdraw prior to their 1st match, a new partner may be added with permission of the Committee and subject to the handicap limits. Once the first match has been played, no substitutions will be allowed

It is the responsibility of BOTH teams to arrange the matches by the due dates, giving at least 2 weekend dates, NO EXTENSIONS will be given for any reason other than the course being unplayable and closed for play by the club due to adverse weather on either the Saturday or Sunday of the last weekend of the round due to be completed.. In periods of exceptionally lengthy course closure the Committee may decide to award an extension. Any extensions for this reason will include another weekend date.

Failure to notify the result by the deadline (either as a match result or a walkover or by tossing a coin) may result in both teams being scratched from the competition. Should a pair withdraw, entry money will be forfeit and go to Captain's charity.

It is the responsibility of the competitors to notify the Committee immediately after the match is completed.

If there are less than four singles or pairs entering a Knockout Competition the competition will not go ahead.

At no time, will a Committee member adjudicate in any dispute between competitors regarding arranging matches. In the event of any other dispute, the ruling of the Committee will be final.

Winter Pairs Knock Out Competitions

The finals of these competitions will be played over 18 holes on any day arranged by the competitors after completion of the semi-finals and prior to the 31st March. If, at any point in the competition, competitors discover that they cannot play during the period allotted for the final, they should forfeit the match to their opponents. Play by dates for each round (determined by draw sheet) must be strictly adhered to.

All Other Knock Out Competitions (summer events)

All Finals will be played over 36 holes and must be played on the designated Finals Day. If, at any point in the competition, competitors discover that they cannot play on the designated Finals Day, they must forfeit the match to their opponents. The only exception will be if a member reaches the final of more than one competition. In this instance the Committee will decide which of the matches is to be rearranged consulting those involved. The match determined to be rescheduled should be played before Finals Day in order to allow all competition winners to be present for an informal trophy presentation on Finals day.

Failure to appear on the designated Finals' day will lead to a potential ban from future competitions for a period to be decided by the Golf Committee after investigating the circumstances.

Finalists should be aware that they may be followed by a referee, members of the committee and other spectators.

FOXHILLS GOLF CLUB CONSTITUTION

Name of Club

The name shall be Foxhills Golf Club hereafter referred to as "The Club" which is constituted as part of 'Foxhills'.

Objects of the Club

The objects of "The Club" shall be to ensure the smooth operation, promotion, playing and organisation of golf competitions, handicaps and social activities to the benefit of its members, and to encourage the development of Junior golfers.

Constitution

The Constitution shall be considered as an extension of the Rules of 'Foxhills'. A copy of the constitution shall be made available to all members of "The Club" and shall be posted on the website.

"The Club" is constituted as a non-profit making Members Club.

The Committee

The Committee shall consist of the

- President,
- Life Vice President,
- Vice-President (Immediate past Captain),
- Captain,
- Vice-Captain,
- A minimum of 6 Seven-Day Playing Members,
- One Five-Day Playing member, if such member volunteers. Such Five-Day playing member shall solely vote on the objects of the club where such objects arise on a Monday to Friday.

No Associate Members shall be permitted on the committee.

The Committee shall appoint an Honorary Treasurer from its Members. He/she shall keep all *the* accounts and lists of assets, including trophies that are the property of "The Club". He/she shall lay before the Annual General Meeting a clear statement of finances of "The Club". He/she shall have the accounts and assets audited annually.

The Captain shall be an ex-officio member of all *sub* committees during his/her term of office.

Any Seven-Day Member who is proposed by the Committee as a Life Vice President of "The Club" and agreed by the Management, can be an official member of the Committee.

Election of Committee

The Chairman of 'Foxhills' shall be President of "The Club"

The Vice-President, Captain and Vice-Captain shall retire from office annually. The Committee shall be responsible for nominations to fill these offices by election at the Annual General Meeting.

The Vice-President, and any Committee Member who has served (4) four years and has not been elected by the Committee as Vice-Captain, shall retire at the Annual General Meeting of "The Club". Members retiring from the Committee cannot stand for re-election for a period of (3) three years following their retirement.

Should there be more than (3) three Committee members retiring in any year, the Committee should apply one or both of the following options to maintain the Committee at the appropriate size as specified above:

- Second another Seven Day golf member with expertise to sit on the committee until the next AGM.
- Nominate to sit on the committee further new Seven or Five-Day golf members for election at the AGM.

To fill vacancies due to the retirements, the Committee shall suggest as many Seven or Five-Day Playing Members as may be necessary and their names shall be posted on the Club House notice board not less than 14 days before and remain so posted until the Annual General Meeting. Other Seven or Five-Day Playing Members of "The Club" willing to serve may be proposed and seconded by any two Seven or Five-Day Members not less than seven days before the Annual General Meeting and their names shall be at once posted on the notice board in the Club House. If no other Members are proposed, those suggested by the Committee shall be declared duly elected, but should other Members be nominated, a ballot shall be held at the Annual General Meeting in such a manner as the Committee may decide.

Once elected to The Committee at the AGM, Committee members are expected to serve 4 (four) full years before retirement from the Committee. However, elected Committee members may leave the Committee under any of the following circumstances:

- By submitting notice of resignation to the Captain at any time during the four years of Committee membership, such notice to normally take effect at the next Annual General Meeting or Extraordinary General Meeting whichever comes the sooner.
- After a vote of "no-confidence" in the member has been passed by the Committee. Such vote of "no-confidence" shall require a majority of two-thirds of the Committee present during the meeting (at which not less than seven must be present when the matter is put to vote). After such a vote has been decided, the member concerned shall be given the opportunity to resign from the Committee with immediate effect. In the event of that resignation not being forthcoming, the member concerned shall be deemed to no longer be a member of the Committee.

Powers of the Committee

The General Committee shall elect annually at the first meeting after the AGM:

- A Handicap Sub Committee, which shall have complete control of handicapping matters at the Club.
- A Competitions Sub Committee, which shall have complete control of competitions organised by the Club.

The Committee has the power to co-opt Members to fill any temporary vacancies. Any such co-opted Members shall retire at the next Annual General Meeting.

The Committee shall appoint from their own number such sub-committees as they consider necessary and may co-opt to them members with special knowledge or relevant experience; such co-opted Members shall retire from the sub committee at the next Annual General Meeting but are eligible for future co-option if required.

Five Members of the Committee shall form a quorum except for a vote of "no-confidence" in a Committee Member, or expulsion of a Member) when the quorum shall be seven.

The Committee shall determine golfing activities in accordance with the Rules of Golf as approved by the Royal and Ancient Golf Club of St. Andrews and shall have control over the following:

- The nomination of Vice-President, Captain and Vice-Captain.
- The election of Members Disciplinary matters with regards to Members and expulsion

Subject to the policy agreed with the management, the arrangement of Competitions, Matches, Tournaments and Club Social Functions for Members and their guests, such arrangements shall be prominently displayed on the Club notice boards and Members shall be deemed conversant therewith.

"The Club" recognises the Royal and Ancient Golf Club of St. Andrews as the ruling body of Amateur Golf and shall abide by the Rules of Golf and Amateur Status as laid down from time to time by the R & A. The Club" shall comply with the Council of National Golf Unions Regulations and the Rules of the Standard Scratch Score and the Unified Handicapping Scheme (and any conditions imposed within the Scheme by England Golf and the Ladies Golf Union).

"The Club" shall affiliate to and comply with the Constitution and Rules of the England Golf, the Surrey County Golf Union, the English Women's Golf and the Surrey Ladies County Golf Association as laid down from time to time.

"The Club" shall duly exercise the disciplinary powers delegated to them under England Golf.

"The Club" shall:

- Provide for an Annual General Meeting of all Members to elect the officers of the Club, which shall include a Captain and sufficient members to form a General Committee.
- The arrangement of the Annual General Meeting in accordance with this Constitution.
- Consideration of such matters as may be referred to them by the Management of 'Foxhills'.

The Committee by formal resolution have at all times access to the Board of Directors of 'Foxhills' through the President.

Meetings

The Annual General Meeting of Members shall be held in September of each year at such time and place that the Committee shall determine, when "The Club's" financial statement will be presented.

Notice of the Annual General Meeting specifying the day, place and hour of the Meeting shall be posted on the Club House notice board at least twenty-eight days before the Annual General Meeting. Members desiring to submit a resolution for consideration at the Annual General Meeting shall send a copy of such resolution to the Captain not less than ten days before the date of the meeting and the Captain shall forthwith post a copy of such resolution on the Club House notice board.

The Committee may call an extraordinary General Meeting when any urgent matter shall arise. They shall be bound to do so within one month of receiving a requisition signed by 75 Seven or Five-Day Members of "The Club". If within 15 minutes of the time appointed for a General Meeting, a quorum of voting Members (such a quorum being 25 Seven and Five-Day Members, a minimum of 13 Seven –Day members) not be present, the meeting, if convened upon the requisition of Members, shall be dissolved. In any other case, it shall stand postponed to the same day in the following week, at the same time and place, and at such postponed Meeting the business shall be transacted whatever the numbers of Members present.

All seven and Five Day Members attending the Annual General Meeting, will be asked to vote, at least upon, any and all Constitutional changes, election of Captain , election of Vice Captain, all Committee appointments, acceptance of Annual Financial statement and appointment of Examiner for future Financial statement. Five-Day playing member shall vote on any other objects/matters of the club where such objects/matters arise on a Monday to Friday. No Associate Members shall be permitted to cast a vote.

Chairmanship of Meetings

At every Annual General Meeting or Extraordinary General Meeting of "The Club" The Vice-President shall preside. In the absence of the Vice-President, the Captain shall preside; in his/her absence a Chairman shall be elected by the members present. The Chairman shall have a casting vote in addition to his/her own vote.

At Meetings of the Committee the Captain shall preside, in his/her absence the Vice- Captain shall preside and in his/her absence the members present shall elect a Chairman. The Chairman shall have a casting vote in addition to his/her own vote.

Membership

Membership to "The Club" shall be subject to applicants satisfying the criteria decided by the Management of 'Foxhills'. Applicants meeting these criteria shall be notified to the Committee for their information as soon as membership is granted by "Foxhills". Any recommendation of the Committee for not granting membership to an applicant shall immediately be submitted to the Management.

Applicants shall advise the Committee of golf handicaps previously held. On joining they shall observe the normal code of etiquette, which is the established custom and practice for the playing of golf and using the club facilities.

Guests

Guests may be introduced in accordance with the Rules of 'Foxhills' and Members shall be responsible for their guests whilst on the premises.

Financial Year

The Financial year of the "The Club" commences on 1st. July annually.

Expulsion

The Committee may request the Management of 'Foxhills' to expel from "The Club" any Member whose conduct is, in the opinion of the Committee, injurious to the character or interests of the Club or renders such Member unfit to associate with "The Club" or to remain a Member of "The Club". The Committee shall enquire into the conduct in question and an opportunity shall be given to such members to defend, justify or explain their conduct.

If it is the opinion of at least two-thirds of the Committee present on voting at the meeting (at which not less than seven must be present when the matter is enquired into) that the Member has failed to justify the conduct complained of, or to explain it satisfactorily, the Committee may request the management of 'Foxhills' to expel such Member from "The Club", or request any other such sanction deemed appropriate by the Committee.

Any Member expelled or who has resigned in anticipation of such action, shall immediately forfeit all privileges of membership and all rights and remedies against "The Club" or its property or funds and no such Member shall be admitted into the Club or premises as a visitor or guest.

Amendments to the Constitution

The Constitution shall not be amended except at a General Meeting after due notice and with the agreement of the Management. Any amendments made shall be prominently displayed on "The Club" notice boards and all members shall be deemed conversant therewith.

Dissolution

In the event of "The Club" being dissolved, a General meeting shall be called, after giving due notice, for the purpose of appointing a Committee to wind up the affairs of "The Club" and given directions as to the disposal of any assets within the scope of the Constitution.

Liabilities

No Member shall be liable for any expenditure incurred by "The Club".

Covid 19 Amendments

in respect of the 2020/2021 year:

- the Committee (including the Captain and Vice Captain, who shall not be required to retire pursuant to clause 6.5) shall be deemed to be re-elected;
- the Captain and Vice Captain shall be deemed to retain their respective positions;
- the four year maximum tenure for Committee members set out in clause 6.5 shall not include the 2019/2020 year for Committee members (including the Captain and Vice Captain) who are deemed to be re-elected under this clause;

Any member shall not be required to physically attend any extraordinary General Meeting (including the extraordinary General Meeting to be held on 23 July 2020 and this clause shall apply retrospectively to this meeting) and/or the Annual General Meeting and may vote by proxy provided the member completes and returns the proxy form by the date set out in the notice of the General Meeting; and

Any extraordinary General Meeting (including the extraordinary General Meeting to be held on 23 July 2020 and this clause shall apply retrospectively to this meeting) and/or the Annual General Meeting may be held electronically.
